Our Story So Far.....

Since opening its doors in early 2016, Bronze Medical Centre has cared for over 60 women at no charge. From the beginning of April 2016 we have taken on 15 new cases, treated 50 revisiting mothers, and had 10 successful deliveries.

The decision to provide the women of Uganda with free healthcare came from our passion and love for women of our community. Antenatal care is very vital to help a child in development, but is also key in helping women in delivery. 435 women out of 100,000 die in process of child birth in Uganda. This means 16 women die giving birth a day. Most of these deaths are attributed to lack of antenatal care. At Bronze Medical Centre we believe no woman should deliver without a midwife.

Meet Hadija

When Hadija arrived at Bronze Medical Centre in late March she was in full labor. Since she had not received any prior antenatal care she was a high risk pregnancy, meaning she was at risk for needing an emergency delivery. Hadija successfully delivered a healthy baby boy, but her placenta was retained. Julian recognized the medical emergency and called for a transport to a district hospital. Once arriving at the hospital Hadija was able to deliver the placenta successfully and without further complication. With the help of Project Hope for Ugandan Women, a nonprofit corporation that works with Bronze Medical Centre to cover the healthcare and delivery cost, Hadija's bills were covered at no cost to her.

Hadija, her new son, and her mom came by to thank Bronze Medical Centre and to have her son examined. Sam then offered to drive Hadija and her son to have him immunized. Again, all expenses were covered at no cost to Hadija.

It is our goal to be able to provide immunizations at our medical center within the next few months.
